Eighth Meeting of the Conference of the Parties to the Convention to Ban the Importation into Forum Island Countries of Hazardous and Radioactive Wastes and to Control the Transboundary Movement and the Management of Hazardous Wastes within the South Pacific Region (Waigani Convention)

Apia, Samoa 18th September 2015

Agenda item 5: Effectiveness of STAC and SCPRC

Purpose:

1. To **seek** the COP meeting's guidance on the new direction in which the STAC and the SCPRC are to perform and manage the affairs of the implementation of the Waigani Convention as per its TOR, in order to improve its effectiveness.

Background:

2. The Conference of the Parties at its Sixth Meeting under Agenda Item 8 on "Future Arrangements for the SCPRC and the STAC", **directed** the Secretariat to seek and act on advice from Member countries on how best to maximise involvement in the Technical and Steering Committees associated with the Waigani Convention and Pacific Regional Centre for the joint implementation of the Basel and Waigani Conventions.

An evaluation report was consequently prepared and discussed at the STAC-4 and SCPRC-3 meetings which acknowledged that both Committees have not performed as fully as expected and discussed ways in which to improve their performance. A number of suggestions were agreed to at both the STAC-4 and SCPRC-3 meetings and these were forwarded to the Seventh session of the Conference of the Parties to the Waigani Convention. The COPs in its decision on Agenda Item 5 on the Effectiveness of STAC and SCPRC: **noted** the value of the content of the Evaluation Report presented by the Chairperson of the STAC and the Secretariat without providing guidance or direction on what the STAC or the SCPRC should be doing.

- 3. At the STAC-5 meeting under Agenda Item 11 on Improving the Function of the STAC, discussions highlighted that STAC was established to assist the work of the Secretariat in pursuing the implementation of the Convention, specifically by:
 - (a) examining the information provided by the Parties on the measures adopted to implement the Convention;
 - (b) working with the Secretariat to develop plans, programs and measures related to the technical and scientific aspects of the Convention;
 - (c) providing guidelines and standards for the environmental sound management of hazardous wastes; and

- (d) assisting in creating coordination between the Waigani and the other regional and global Conventions.
- 4. During the discussions, the similarities between the STAC of the Waigani Convention and the Open-Ended Working Group (OEWG) of the Basel Convention were highlighted and that the STAC should be performing its functions in much the same way as the OEWG. It was noted that these two committees have very similar mandates and roles in how they should be feeding technical and scientific reports and information to their respective COPs. An example of how the OEWG does its work in contained in Annex 1 of this working paper.
- 5. The STAC-5 Meeting then directed the Secretariat to develop the improved mode of operations for future STAC Meetings.
- 6. The Secretariat has studied the manner in which the OEWG operates and proposes to the COP-8 meeting that the WC STAC operates in a similar manner to the BC OEWG while focusing on issues pertaining to the Waigani Convention area. In this regards, the STAC should strengthen and focus its work on dealing with the Pacific-specific matters on:
 - a. Strategic issues;
 - b. Scientific and technical matters;
 - c. Legal, governance and enforcement matters;
 - d. International cooperation and coordination; and
 - e. Programme of work and budget
- 7. The STAC does not have to duplicate the work of the OEWG but can use the work of the OEWG as a guide with a focus on matters specific to our region. This will, in time, improve the effectiveness of the STAC and the SCPRC and provide quality information to the COP to discuss and make decisions on.

Recommendation

- 8. The Meeting is invited to:
 - discuss the role of the STAC and SCPRC;
 - **provide** direction under which the STAC and the SCPRC is to perform in the future in managing the implementation of the Waigani Convention as per its TOR; and
 - **direct** the Secretariat on any further actions required to progress this matter.
