What is the lokwe Bag?

The lokwe Bag is a special trash bag made for Majuro.

How do you use it?

Using the lokwe Bag is simple. Fill it with your trash, tie the handles at the top and then hang it off the ground for collection.

Why do we need the lokwe Bag?

At the moment only some areas on Majuro have wheelie bins to store trash for weekly collection. The wheelie bins are old, very expensive to replace and slow to empty. They also require special trucks to empty them. lokwe Bags make trash collection easier, faster and cheaper.

Where can you get bags?

Look out for free promotional bags at events in October and November! After the launch, lokwe Bags will be available in grocery stores throughout Majuro and will cost 30 cents each.

Why should I pay for a bag?

lokwe Bags are made for Majuro. They are specially designed for trash collection and the money from the sale of the bags will help pay for the cost of trash collection for everybody on the island.
