1. Brief Description

Hosting events in the Pacific presents both opportunities and challenges for sustainability. With increasing concerns over plastic pollution, waste management, and carbon emissions, event organisers have a responsibility to minimise the environmental impact of events.

Greening events of any size and type such as meetings and conferences, and sporting competitions provide strategic opportunities to motivate and reinforce behaviour change among large numbers of people. Planning and implementing practical sustainability steps and strategies is fundamental, and the Pacific has benefitted directly from the application of effective plans and strategies such as those used at the 2019 and 2023 Pacific Games in Samoa and Solomon Islands, respectively.

At the side event, a panel discussion led by technical experts from the environment, sports, tourism, government, industry, and community sectors will deliberate about incorporating sustainable practices throughout the event planning, organisation, and execution phases from conception to completion, to ultimately minimise negative environmental impacts and maximise positive social contributions. Key themes of the discussion will be sustainability, social responsibility, collaboration, innovation, best practises and impact.

The Australian Government funded Pacific Ocean Litter Project being implemented by SPREP is developing the 'Guide for Greening Events'. The draft guide will be presented at the event as part of the validation process to finalise the tool before it's published.
