

### 32<sup>nd</sup> SPREP MEETING SIDE EVENTS REQUEST FORM

### 1 - 5 September 2025, Sheraton Samoa

#### 1. Title of the Side Event

Highlighting SPREP's newly established Climate Science and Information (CSI) Program, upcoming Weather Ready Pacific Radar Installation Plans, the Memorandum of Understanding with the Pacific Disability Forum, and the MOU signing with Earth Sciences New Zealand.

### 2. Brief Description (What the side event is about)

### i. CSI Establishment & WRP Radar Plan (45mins)

The side event will focus on the establishment of SPREP's new department, *Climate Science and Information (CSI)*, and the importance of investing in Early Warning systems in the Pacific region to address climate change impacts specifically. One of the key investments under the Weather Ready Pacific Programme (WRP) is the establishment of the regional radar network including the review of the Tonga Radar and installation plans for weather radars in Samoa and the Solomon Islands. The VanKIRAP project under the GCF, SPREP is also investing on a Radar for Vanuatu.

The proposed format is to begin with a presentation introducing the new CSI department and its mandates and responsibilities, followed by an update on WRP activities, highlighting both completed work and future plans. In particular the Pacific Regional Radar Network. UNEP will also be invited to provide inputs from the GCF CIS-Pac5 investments on Radars in Tuvalu, Niue, Cook Islands, Palau and Marshal Islands
