I am pleased to provide further information on the 15th Ordinary Meeting of the Contracting Parties to the *Convention for the Protection of the Natural Resources and Environment of the South Pacific Region and related protocols* (Noumea Convention) and the 10<sup>th</sup> Ordinary Meeting of the Contracting Parties to the *Convention to Ban the Importation into Forum Island Countries of Hazardous and Radioactive Wastes and to Control the Transboundary Movement and the Management of Hazardous Wastes within the South Pacific Region (Waigani Convention) that will be held in Apia, Samoa, on Thursday 29 August 2019 and Friday 30 August 2019 respectively, prior to the 29th SPREP Meeting. ## Noumea Convention

Representatives of non-Party members are invited as observers to the Meeting and are encouraged to consider ratifying the Convention.

## Waigani Convention

The Parties to the Waigani Convention are: Australia, Cook Islands, Federated States of Micronesia, Fiji, Kiribati, New Zealand, Niue, Papua New Guinea, Samoa, Solomon Islands, Tonga, Tuvalu and Vanuatu. Representatives of non-Party members are invited as observers to the Meeting and are encouraged to consider ratifying the Convention. Funding is available to support the attendance of one representative from each of the following Countries – Cook Islands, Kiribati, Niue and Tuvalu.
