The North Pacific Office kept busy during the fourth quarter of 2025 with high-level accomplishments listed here:

- SPREP NPO presented founding documents at the Micronesian Island Forum in Majuro.
- SPREP brought on new NPO Manager, Mr. Michael Honeth. He, together with Mr. Kilom Ishiguro as Technical Expert and Liaison Officer, make up the two full-time staff at the NPO.
- ❖ At SPREP32 NPO side-meeting Kiribati, Nauru and RMI approved 'in principle' the foundational documents for the NPO. Digital binder sent out to Members to encourage consensus endorsement early next year.
- SPREP accepted lead in Nauru Greening Drylands project with planning activities expected to start in 2026.
- ❖ Mission to FSM led by DDG. Initiated Strategic Planning Framework (CTSPF) with target completion for Q1 2026.
- RMI CTSPF moved forward with target completion for Q1 2026.
- Close-out meeting for GEF6 Regional Invasives Project held in RMI.
- ❖ COSSPAC CSI EARWatch and CliDE mission travelled to FSM, Palau and RMI.
- Supported invasive rat and bird eradications in RMI, and war on weeds in Kosrae and Palau.
