Subject: Request for tenders: **Review and update the Niue integrated Solid and Hazardous Waste Management Strategy 2015**

1. Will SPREP or the DOE be able to provide information on progress against the current strategy to inform the literature review?

**Response: Niue Waste Department will be able to provide details of their activities in delivering the waste strategy.**

2. Is there any waste data (apart from the 2021/2022 waste audits in Niue) that has been collected that will need analysis as part of the Literature Review?

**Response: Waste audit data should be sufficient for this purpose**

3. The 5-year action plan phase refers to the deliverable of a legislative guidance framework. Can you please confirm if this deliverable is for recommended improvements to the legislative guidance framework (Assessment of Legislative Frameworks Governing Waste Management in Niue ([sprep.org](http://sprep.org))) rather than a fully updated framework?

**Response: The intent of the 'action plan' is a plan for the implementation of the waste strategy, and not specifically linked to any element of the strategy work. The intent of the Action Plan is to provide guidance to the Waste Department of the priority level work needed to implement the approved strategy.**

4. Does a written report exist of the Stakeholder Engagement conducted by the Niue Department of Environment in February 2023 relating to Waste Management Legislation? If so will this be made available to support strategy development?

**Response: Confirming a written report has been developed and will be supplied to the selected contractor**
