Subject: Request for tenders: **Literature Review and Assessment of small-scale waste management technology options**

1. Does the scope require each country to be assessed (i.e. Cook Islands, Democratic Republic of Timor-Leste, Federated States of Micronesia, Fiji, Kiribati, Nauru, Niue, Palau, Papua New Guinea, Republic of Marshall Islands, Samoa, Solomon Islands, Tonga, Tuvalu, Vanuatu) or to assess different small scale waste management technologies and select example countries these may be applicable to or assess a selected number of countries / group countries together

Response: The scope is to assess available small-scale waste management technologies that would be suitable for use in the listed Pacific countries and remote communities to manage waste. The technology does not need to be currently in operation in the Pacific countries.

2. Confirm the PWP 8 target waste streams (asbestos, e-waste and healthcare waste, recyclables, organic waste, disaster waste, bulky waste and wastewater pollution effluent)

Response: Asbestos, e-waste, healthcare waste, recyclables, organic waste, disaster waste, bulky waste and **water impacted by solid waste (not wastewater pollution effluent)**

3. What type of baseline information can be provided to support the project e.g. waste quantities for each target waste stream, current disposal routes, current waste infrastructure in the countries, waste management initiatives etc.

Response: Baseline data is not expected to be required for this review. Instead focus your review on the technology available in the specified price range.

4. Does each PWP 8 waste stream need to be addressed in the selection of waste technologies

Response: Preferably. We require a list of all available technologies that can address at least one of the PWP eight target waste streams. If there is not a small-scale technology for addressing, say, asbestos, then note this in your report.
